- Visit colleges -No Official/ Unofficial Visits Befote August 1st of Junior Year
- Coaches can send camp information, questionnaires, and recruiting materials
- GO TO COLLEGE GAMES
- Spring – Possible scholarship offers for Girls (Boys & Girls timeline differs here)
  - Boys scholarship offers begin Junior year

**Early Decision and Early Action plans**  
 allow you to apply early usually in November. Decision from the college will be before the regular plan. However, since by December 1st you are accepted to your first-choice college.

## JUNIOR TIMELINE ACADEMIC - DOs

- Complete College applications (you may get a wait list)
- Complete your transcript for the summer
- ACT/SAT Prep for possible
- Research and visit: Reference Sheet
- Apply for scholarships!
- Make sure you understand how to apply
- Early Decision or Early Action!
- Be sure to email your coach, scholarship money may depend on it!

**PARENTS:** Make sure that you get your own letter early to find out

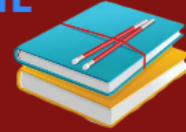

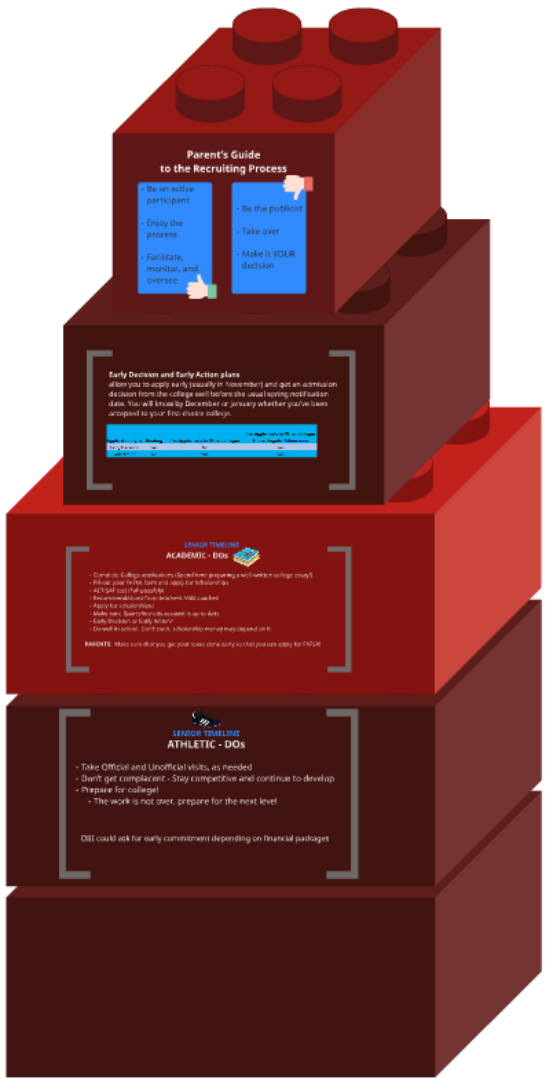
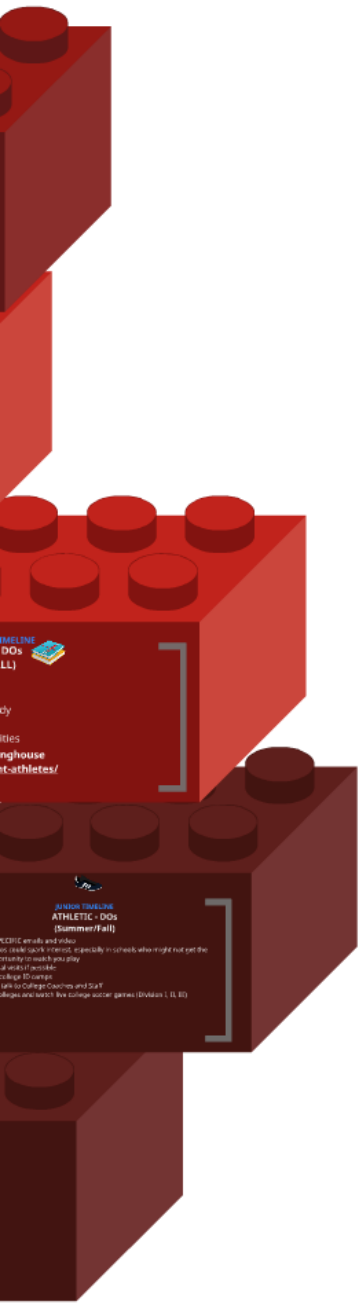
# JUNIOR TIMELINE

## ACADEMIC - DOs

### (SPRING)



- SAT/ACTs completed and evaluated
- When signing up for senior year classes-Challenge Yourself!
- Double-Check your transcript to make sure it is accurate
- Begin reflecting on which Teachers/Coaches you will ask for recommendations.
  - Recommendation Reference Sheet
- Understand how your high school handles college applications (Do you have a college counselor/ advisor?)
  - Scholarships/Grants/Student Loans

## SENIOR TIMELINE ATHLETIC - DOs

- Take Official and Unofficial visits, as needed
- Don't get complacent - Stay competitive and continue to develop
- Prepare for college!
  - The work is not over, prepare for the next level

DIII could ask for early commitment depending on financial packages

## SENIOR TIMELINE

### ACADEMIC - DOS



- Complete College applications (Spend time preparing a well-written college essay!)
- Fill out your FAFSA form and apply for Scholarships
- ACT/SAT test (Fall possibly)
- Recommendations from teachers AND coaches
- Apply for scholarships!
- Make sure SportsRecruits account is up to date
- Early Decision or Early Action?
- Do well in school: Don't slack, scholarship money may depend on it

**PARENTS:** Make sure that you get your taxes done early so that you can apply for FAFSA!

## Early Decision and Early Action plans

allow you to apply early (usually in November) and get an admission decision from the college well before the usual spring notification date. You will know by December or January whether you've been accepted to your first-choice college.

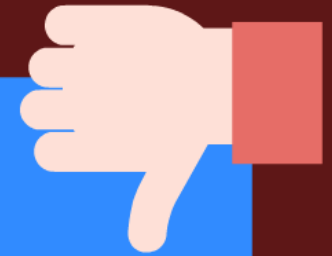
